- ★ **Vote by Mail:** When you know in advance or think that you may be unable to vote on Election Day, you can vote by **absentee ballot**. You must apply for an absentee ballot through your election clerk. Most will allow you to download the application from their web site. Absentee ballots must be mailed back to the election clerk five days prior to the election. Voting by mail runs from February 6th through March 13th.
- ★ **Early Voting:** Any registered voter may vote early. There are multiple locations throughout each county at which to vote early. For exact locations and hours, contact your local election authority or call the IFI office for more information. Early voting runs from March 3rd through March 15th. Identification is required.
- ★ **Grace Period Voting:** Grace-period voting is available to individuals who were unable to register to vote or changed their address prior to the close of registration (28 days prior to an election). The grace period for registration is from the 27th through the 3rd day prior to an election.
- ★ **Election Day:** On March 18th polls are open from 6 a.m. - 7 p.m.
