

# Illinois School Proficiency FAILURE 2022

In 1983, the National Commission on Excellence in Education warned of “a rising tide of mediocrity that threatens our very future as a Nation and a people.” Today we can unequivocally state that we are at a crisis. Government schools are failing to educate students to proficiency levels in English Language Arts, Math and Science. And even though we have dramatically increased our spending on K–12 public education, our students are being subjected to social engineering courses that are corrupting them morally, spiritually, and, in some cases, harming them physically and mentally.

According to findings published in The Condition of College and Career Readiness

2019, **only 37 percent of ACT-tested graduates in the class of 2019 met at least three of the four ACT College Readiness Benchmarks of English, Reading, Math and Science.**

Many student’s ability to think, speak and write clearly, their intellectual development and their moral consciences are being corrupted. A quick look at the **proficiency rates** in some of Illinois’ **largest school districts** should alarm all of us.
